Maastricht is served by five airports. The closest one is Maastricht/Aachen airport.

Maastricht Aachen Airport can be reached with Veolia route 59 Maastricht-Sittard and vice versa. This bus stops at the Dutch Railway (NS) stations in Maastricht, Sittard and Beek-Elsloo.

Amsterdam Airport Schiphol

Schiphol train station is situated directly below the airport. The approximate journey time duration from Amsterdam to Maastricht by train is 2:45hours.

The ticket machines are located near the platforms at Schiphol Plaza. Tickets (for domestic and international travel) are also available from the Ticket and Service desks, which are situated close to the red/white-checked cube at Schiphol Plaza. Staff at the desk will also be able to provide you with train departure information and general information on travelling by train in Holland.

You travel by checking in and out at the train station before and after your journey.

This city of 120.000 inhabitants is very close to international cities such as Aachen, Düsseldorf, Liège, Brussels and Antwerp. Maastricht stood at the cradle of the European Union in 1992 at the time of the signing of the Maastricht Treaty - the treaty on European Union.

Restaurants – Dutch Cuisine

Traditionally, Dutch cuisine is simple and straightforward, with many vegetables and little meat; breakfast and lunch are typically

bread with toppings while dinner is meat and potatoes, supplemented with seasonal vegetables. The Dutch diet was relatively high in carbohydrates and fat, reflecting the dietary need of the laborers whose culture molded the country, and contains many dairy products. Without many refinements, it is best described as rustic, though many holidays are still celebrated with special foods. In the course of the twentieth century this diet changed and became much more cosmopolitan, with most international cuisines being represented in the major cities.

Safety

Maastricht is a very safe and a fairly quiet place. As in any bigger city, beware of pickpockets. The only announcement about safety that has to be mentioned is the strong culture of cycling that the Netherlands is famous for. For people from countries where cycling is not so usual it might be hard to pay attention to passing cyclists and some traffic collisions may occur. We would advise everyone to stay aware of their surroundings and carefully observe their lefts and rights when crossing the streets as bicycles are not as loud as cars when passing by.

Shopping

Markets

Open air markets are a favorite way of shopping in Netherlands. Maastricht is a place of several markets. The most famous market is located at the Markt square. It is set up every Wednesday and Friday and you can buy all sort of goods there such as plants, flowers, clothes, cosmetics, fresh food, etc.

Maastricht's well planned streets are perfect to accommodate many small shops. The variety offers all kinds of styles within the whole price range. Most shops are located around the main square of the city- Vrijthof. Exclusive and unique designs can be found in the Stokstraatkwartier quarter.

In the times of rain there are some places to go shopping too. Department stores of Maastricht: Mosae Forum (between Markt and Maasboulevard), De Bojenkorf (Achter het Vleeschhuis 26) and Entre Deux (between Vrijthof and Markt)

Smoking Policy

The Netherlands has national "smoke-free" legislation covering all public indoor areas. No smoking is allowed in any indoor place.

T

Taxi

Taxi price from the city center to MECC Conference center should not exceed 20€. There are several services providing car lifts.

Tax Refund

If you are a resident from outside the EU, you are entitled to claim your taxes back when shopping in the Netherlands. There is a tax refund office at Amsterdam airport. Keep your receipts and request gift stores about taxes back. In particular the souvenir stores will be able to assist you.

Time Difference

The time in the whole Netherlands is UTC+2:00 in the summertime (the end of the summertime- in the subject of time change- is the last Sunday of October). Overall the time zone is called Central European Time (+1), also known as CET (+1).

Tipping

By law, the service charge for dining at restaurants is included in the price of the meal. If you feel the service was exceptional, you can leave a tip (10%) in addition to the price on the bill. In bars and cafes, it is usual to round up or leave some small change.

Transportation in Maastricht

The main and best connection to MECC conference center is by train. MECC Maastricht is a 5 minute walk from Maastricht-Randwyck station and a stone's throw from Maastricht Central station. Every 15 minutes a train from Maastricht Central station arrives to Maastricht Randwyck at the approximate cost of 2,20€. There is also a tram and bus service in the city.
